Applications

- Students must submit a cover letter, photograph and current resume as part of their application.
- Applications are due by **June 16, 2023**, but earlier is always better!

Eligibility

- Students of all genders are eligible.
- Students currently attending or recently graduated from university or community colleges may apply.
- Student must describe "why" attending the conference would benefit them professionally or academically in their cover letters.

Sponsorship Details

- The U.S. WIN Student Sponsorship includes the cost of one conference registration; hotel accommodations with double occupancy with another sponsored student, checking in July 23 and checking out July 26; the Monday evening special event; all meals and receptions hosted by U.S. WIN during the conference; and pairing with a mentor for the duration of the conference.

Getting Started

To get started as a mentor:

- Submit the application [here](https://forms.gle/JJSNxcmfMfBHaYho8) (available directly at <https://forms.gle/JJSNxcmfMfBHaYho8>).
- After you receive your student's name and contact information, introduce yourself via email and get to know your student a bit before the beginning of the conference.
- Explore interests with student by asking questions and promoting discussion.
- Once the conference begins, attend the Student and Mentor Orientation where you will meet face-to-face.
- Participate in the Student-Mentor event, and encourage participation in other conference sessions and events.
- There is no prescribed formula for the student/mentor relationship. Just be a friend and make yourself as available; the rest will fall into place.
